At Grande Prairie Christian School we ...

are a school of choice within the Grande Prairie Public School Division. We provide the Alberta school curriculum and Biblical teaching delivered from a Christian world view. We teach Bible as a core academic class, provide daily devotions for students and offer a weekly chapel service for all. We also offer strong academic, music, and extra-curricular sports programs.

Our school serves approximately 445 students in kindergarten through grade nine with twenty teachers and five support staff.

Our Education Plan is focused on:

Priority: Teaching and Learning

Outcome: Quality teaching through intentional planning for optimal assessment practices to meet the learning needs of students.

Strategies

- Introduction of planning templates with a focus on assessment practices
- Ongoing professional learning on assessment and planning throughout the year during PL days
- Small group instruction everyday
- Emphasis on formative assessment practices in administrative observations
- Lessons incorporate a range of instructional strategies
- Enhanced small group instruction to support literacy achievement
- Early literacy intervention program based on short cycles of formative data
- Identification and tracking of students with literacy deficits through ongoing assessments
- Professional Learning focuses on assessment and planning

Evidence

- PAT percentage of students at the Acceptable level increases
- Percentage of students working at grade level on classroom coordinated assessments
- Evidence of optimal assessment practices during administrative observations
- Long range plans reflect planning for assessment
- Lesson plans show evidence of both formative and summative assessment

Priority: Inclusion

Outcome: Promoting a safe and caring environment for all our students where the spiritual, emotional, and physical well-being of staff and students is supported.

Strategies

- Development of a more complete and robust scope and sequence for our Bible classes to ensure that wellness outcomes are being met
- Inclusion of KUSP (knowledge, understanding, skills, procedures) designations in Bible planning documents
- Weekly school chapels focused on Biblical values and social emotional learning
- Daily teacher-led devotions
- Weekly staff devotions
- Investment in recreational infrastructure to support physical fitness and emotional well-being
- Explicit Biblical social emotional learning instruction integrated with academic instruction
- Monthly parent communications via newsletter to share school goals and events
- Administrators present outside school before and after classes to facilitate parent engagement
- Weekly teacher newsletters to promote school goals and culture

Outcome: Enabling and promoting spiritual development in students through school structures, intentional Christian pedagogy, and relationships.

Strategies

- Weekly chapels
- Devotions daily
- Bible class
- All staff are committed to participating in and role modeling Christian values, behavior and relationships in the school
- Integrating Christian world view into Alberta curriculum
- Being intentional about using Christian resources across curriculum
- Embed Biblical principles and consider cross curricular instruction in unit planning and year planning
- Giving our students the tools to advocate for Christian truths and be lifelong disciples
- Teachers are intentionally utilizing the KUSPs framework in planning and implementing Christian principles in the Alberta curriculum

Evidence

- Evidence of social emotional learning from a Christian perspective being taught during classroom observations
- Assurance survey results indicate students and parents feel safe and secure in the school
- Retention of students and increase in student numbers
- Continuation of low number of formal disciplinary interventions needed (PowerSchool Incidents)
- Students demonstrating Biblical knowledge across subjects
